

France-NATO: [Paris is maintaining its hard line in NATO negotiations both with the Fourteen and bilaterally with the US.]

[France has refused any modification of its tough stand on the relationship between French forces in Germany and NATO, and further discussions in the North Atlantic Council have been postponed until September. If the permanent representatives are unable to reach agreement by then, the question may have to be referred back to the NATO foreign ministers.]


[The French apparently believe that their bargaining position with the Fourteen has been strengthened by Erhard's clear indication to De Gaulle last week that Bonn wanted French troops to remain in Germany. Paris probably hopes that if an agreement with the Germans can be reached, the other NATO members will relax their requirements for close ties between the French forces and NATO.]

[The next French-German negotiating session is scheduled for 3 August. The other NATO members fear that Bonn may allow the bilateral talks to get too far ahead, however, and have urged Bonn to make the meeting "pro forma" and not to meet again until progress is made on the France-Fourteen front.]

[Regarding the bilateral talks in progress between Paris and Washington, a French official said De Gaulle's instructions were that "not a man, not a stock" could be left in France in peacetime. The official maintained that France would decide on US wartime re-entry rights only after war had started.]






Congo (Kinshasa): Negotiations between Premier Mulamba and the mutinous Katangese troops in Kisangani have not yet produced a settlement. There was an outbreak of gunfire between the Katangese and the Congolese Army troops night before last, but the city was calm again yesterday. The French-speaking mercenaries in Kisangani, although disturbed by reports of the arrest of members of their unit in Kinshasa, have not become involved in the mutiny and continue their protection of Premier Mulamba.

Cuba: The Fourth Latin American Student Congress (CLAE) opens today in Havana and will continue through 9 August. According to the president of the Cuban Federation of University Students, a total of 150 delegates from 47 national student unions are attending, including representatives from North and South Vietnam. [redacted] the Soviet-front International Union of Students in Prague is promoting the CLAE as its regional organization in Latin America and is providing financial and transportation assistance.] An anti-imperialist, anticolonialist theme will be used to sustain a propaganda campaign against the United States.
