



Venezuela-Cuba: [Caracas is considering military harassment of Cuba.]

[Former president Betancourt went even further in a television address on 1 June. He suggested that unless Castro ends his policy of aggression the OAS should consider forming a regular armed force to use against Cuba.]

[Venezuelan harassment, if carried out, would be militarily insignificant and difficult to sustain against Cuban defenses. Havana would undoubtedly blame the United States for any attacks that took place.]






South Korea: Increasing student demonstrations in protest against election irregularities have resulted in numerous clashes with the police. High school students have joined those from universities in the antigovernment protests, which have spread from Seoul to other principal cities. If the unrest continues to mount, the government may be forced to use the armed forces and to impose martial law.

*Colombia: Troops occupied the campus of National University in Bogota the evening of 13 June to halt a five-day series of increasingly violent student demonstrations. The demonstrations began as a protest against a 30 percent increase in bus fares--a substantial part of the average student's budget--but extremists and professional agitators have spurred them on with harangues about a multitude of grievances, some spurious. President Lleras ordered troops onto the campus last September for similar reasons, thereby precipitating a nationwide student strike. He probably is braced for repercussions to the government's latest action.
