ORGANIZATION OF THE MINISTRY OF LIGHT INDUSTRY USSR

[Numbers in parentheses refer to appended sources.]

The NKLP SSSR (People's Commissariat of Light Industry USSR) was established by decree of the Central Executive Committee and the Council of People's Commissars USSR on 5 January 1932. It was reorganized by the Stalin Constitution of 1936 into a union-republic commissariat. The Central Executive Committee and the Council of People's Commissars USSR confirmed the formation of union-republic commissariats of light industry in the RSFSR and the Ukraine on 19 September 1936. NKLP (people's commissariats of light industry) were set up in the remaining union republics by the government decrees of 22 December 1936 and 3, 8, 10, and 11 January 1937. On 2 January 1939 the NKLP SSSR was divided into the NKTP SSSR (People's Commissariat of Textile Industry USSR) and the NKLP SSSR. (1) When on 15 March 1946 all people's commissariats became ministries, the NKTP SSSR and the NKLP USSR became the Ministry of Textile Industry USSR and the Ministry of Light Industry USSR, respectively. These two ministries were reunited into the Ministry of Light Industry USSR by ukase of the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet USSR on 28 December 1948. (2)

The most complete information available concerning the organizational structure and functional competence of what is now the Ministry of Light Industry USSR is embodied in a statute confirmed by the USSR government on 21 July 1938. (3)

Statute on the Structure of the NKLP SSSR

1. The NKLP SSSR is a union-republic people's commissariat and, according to Articles 76 and 78 of the Stalin Constitution, is invested with jurisdiction over light industry enterprises of union, republic, and local subordination.

2. The NKLP SSSR is headed by a People's Commissar.
3. The People's Commissar is invested by Articles 72 and 87 of the Stalin Constitution with jurisdiction over the NKLP SSSR and republic NKLP.
4. According to Article 73 of the Stalin Constitution, the People's Commissar issues orders and instructions within his competence in fulfillment of existing laws, decrees, and regulations of the Council of People's Commissars USSR; he also checks on their execution.
5. According to Article 76 of the Stalin Constitution, the NKLP SSSR has jurisdiction over the following industries: cotton, wool, silk, linen, leather footwear, tanning extracts, artificial leather, fur, glass, bast crops, felt, sewed products, textile haberdashery, cotton wool, hemp, jute, preliminary processing of hemp and flax, cotton ginning, artificial fibers, production of textile machines and parts, production of subsidiary materials for light industry, and construction enterprises.
6. The NKLP SSSR:
 - a. Exercises direct jurisdiction over all light industry enterprises of union subordination and, through republic NKLP, has jurisdiction over light industry enterprises of republic and local subordination
 - b. Draws up and presents for approval to the USSR government summary plans (prospective, yearly, and quarterly) for light industry enterprises of union, republic, and local subordination, and supervises fulfillment of such plans
 - c. Organizes technical and material supply for enterprises of union subordination and supervises organization of supply for republic NKLP
 - d. Directs sales for enterprises of union subordination and sales of planned and regulated goods for enterprises of republic and local subordination, and directs republic NKLP in selling the remaining products for enterprises of republic and local subordination
 - e. Proffers technical guidance and aid to enterprises and trusts of union, republic, and local subordination; introduces new techniques and issues patents for inventions
 - f. Supervises organization of work norms, pay, recruiting of workers, and the Stakhanovite movement in light industry enterprises of union subordination; also instructs republic NKLP in these matters
 - g. Directs construction in enterprises of union subordination and supervises construction in republic NKLP
 - h. Directly finances light industry enterprises of union subordination and those of republic subordination through republic NKLP
 - i. Contracts for agricultural products required by the NKLP SSSR; inspects wool
 - j. Has direct jurisdiction over subordinate educational institutions and scientific-research institutes; supervises and directs republic NKLP in recruiting cadres
 - k. Supervises accounts and balances of subordinate enterprises and installations; examines summary accounts of the work of enterprises and organizations of republic and local subordination.

7. The People's Commissar appoints industrial and technical personnel of its main administrations, divisions, sections, and directly subordinate trusts and enterprises, confirms chiefs and deputy chiefs of republic main administrations, and also industrial and technical personnel of the largest enterprises and trusts of republic subordination.

8. The People's Commissar may suspend or countermand orders and instructions of republic NKLP which contradict laws and decrees of the USSR government and/or orders and instructions of the NKLP SSSR.

9. The NKLP SSSR, in order to (1) administer light industry enterprises of union subordination (directly or through trusts), and (2) establish leadership for enterprises of republic and local subordination, has the following main administrations:

- First Main Administration of Cotton Industry of Moscow Oblast (1st Glavmoskhlopprom)
- Second Main Administration of Cotton Industry of Moscow Oblast (2d Glavmoskhlopprom)
- Main Administration of Cotton Industry of Ivanovo Oblast (Glavivkhlopprom)
- Main Administration of Cotton Industry of Leningrad Oblast (Glavlenskhllopprom)
- Main Administration of Cotton Industry for New Districts and New Towns (Glavnovkhlopprom)
- Main Administration of Cotton Procurement and Cotton Gins (Glavzagotkhlopprom)
- Main Administration of Linen Industry (Glavl'nokhlopprom)
- Main Administration of Linen Industry for New Districts and New Towns (Glavnovl'nokhlopprom)
- Main Administration for Preliminary Processing of Flax (Glavl'nozavody)
- Main Administration of Bast Crops (Glavnovlub)
- Main Administration of Wool Industry (Glavsherst')
- Main Administration of Silk Industry (Glavshelk)
- Main Administration of Knitted-Wear Industry (Glavtrikotazh)

10. At the head of each main administration is a chief who carries out industrial and technical management of enterprises, trusts, and organizations subordinate to his main administration

The directives issued by chiefs of main administrations of the NKLP SSSR to chiefs of republic level administrations are valid provided they do not contradict orders and instructions of the People's Commissar or are not countermanded by the latter.

11. The following divisions and sectors are organized within each main administration of the NKLP SSSR:

Industrial-Management Division

Technical Division

Republic and Local Industry Division

Capital Construction Division

Supply Division

Sales Division

Mechanical Repair Division, for cotton, wool, flax, silk, and knitted-wear main administrations

Planning Sector

Finance Sector

Cadres Sector

NOTE: Technical divisions and republic and local industry divisions are not included in the main administrations of the cotton industry, the Main Administration of Linen Industry, and the Main Administration for Preliminary Processing of Flax.

12. The Industrial-Management Division of a main administration exercises daily inspection and operational control and renders aid to enterprises, trusts, and organizations subordinate to the main administration.

The Industrial-Management Divisions control the employment of dispatcher-engineers. The latter are attached to main administration enterprises, where they daily supervise operations of such enterprises.

13. The Technical Division of a main administration is concerned with: the technical policy of the branch of industry concerned; production methods and supervision of production; breakdowns and ways of preventing them; installation of new equipment; and consultations on technical problems. The division also renders these services to enterprises of republic and local subordination.

14. The Republic and Local Industry Division of a main administration reviews quarterly, yearly, and prospective plans and supervises plan fulfillment for republic and local light industry.

15. The Capital Construction Division of a main administration works out plans for capital construction, controls fulfillment of plans under way, and also proffers technical operational aid.

16. The Working Cadres and Pay Sector of a main administration organizes recruitment of workers, regulates pay, and finds ways of eliminating labor turnover.

17. The Sales Division of a main administration supervises sales in subordinate enterprises, concludes sales agreements, and supervises the activities of sales organizations and the retail chain of the main administration.

18. The structure of the NKLP SSSR includes the following:

a. Main Administration for Construction (Glavstroylegprom), which functions through construction trusts subordinate to it.

b. Main Administration of Supplies (Glavsnablegprom), which provides technical supplies and materials for light industry. It also has supply offices and subsidiary production enterprises operating on a cost-accounting basis.

c. Main Administration for Educational Institutions (GUUZ), which administers educational institutions subordinate to the NKLP SSSR.

d. Main Administration for Sales of Cotton Products (Tekstil'sbyt), which distributes products manufactured by cotton industry enterprises of the NKLP SSSR and of republic NKLP; it also distributes other textile products in towns and rayons of the USSR not having commercial outlets for corresponding branches of the textile industry.

e. All-Union Combine for Leather Procurement (Soyuzzagotkoz), which procures and does preliminary processing of hides, and supplies raw materials to the leather industry.

f. All-Union Combine for Wool Procurement (Soyuzzagotsherst'), which procures and does preliminary processing on wool, and supplies wool industry enterprises.

g. All-Union Office of Soyuzutil', which procures various sorts of usable raw materials.

h. Artificial Fiber Trust (VTIV)

i. Canvas Trust

19. Under the NKLP SSSR there is an Inspection and Control Group which supervises: (1) republic NKLP, (2) main administrations, sections, divisions, trusts, and all industrial organizations of the NKLP SSSR, (3) fulfillment of party and government decrees for light industry, and (4) execution of orders and instructions issued by the People's Commissar.

20. The NKLP SSSR has the following divisions and sections:

a. The Planning Division, which works out current and prospective plans for all light industry, including planning for branches of industry subordinate to republic NKLP; it presents such plans for confirmation by the People's Commissar.

b. The Technical Division of the Cotton Industry which has the following responsibilities: solves technical problems; works out technical reconstruction plans; selects equipment and supervises its installation; plans production; investigates breakdowns and finds ways to eliminate them; advises on technical problems (including enterprises of republic and local subordination); and directs scientific-research institutes of the cotton industry.

c. The Technical Division of the Linen Industry and Preliminary Processing of Flax, which carries out the same functions for the linen industry as the corresponding technical division for the cotton industry.

d. The Sewing Industry Division, which draws up summary production and capital construction plans for sewing industries of republic and local subordination. It also draws up plans for raw material distribution and presents them to the People's Commissar for confirmation; the division also provides for the introduction of new techniques in the industry.

e. The Commercial Sector, which develops ways of utilizing goods produced in enterprises of union, republic, and local subordination; the section also supervises plans for utilization of light industry products; works for improvement in quality of product; and supervises sales of main administrations of the NKLP SSSR and individual branches of light industry of republic subordination.

f. The Finance Sector, which draws up summary financial plans to be presented to the People's Commissar (for confirmation); the section also supervises fulfillment of plans, financial work of main administrations of the NKLP SSSR, and fixes delivery prices for light industry products.

g. Central Bookkeeping, which does bookkeeping for light industry, advises and controls work of the NKLP bookkeeping organs, and examines accounts and balances of light industry organizations.

h. Sector for Training and Selecting Cadres, which provides workers for the NKLP SSSR and assigns graduates of technical schools; it also acquires executives, engineers, and technicians.

i. The Working Cadres and Pay Sector, which supervises organized recruiting of workers and has charge of labor problems and pay, safety methods, organization of work to increase production, and the Stakhanovite movement; it also undertakes to eliminate labor turnover.

j. The Capital Construction Sector, which works out summary plans for capital construction in light industry, which are presented to the People's Commissar for confirmation; the section controls capital construction plans, plans the allocation of construction materials, and provides estimates and supplies for construction projects.

k. The Transport Division, which plans rail and water transport of goods for light industry; it also supervises transport for main administrations, trusts, enterprises, and organizations of the NKLP SSSR.

l. The Statistical-Accounting Sector, which supervises statistical accounting for light industry.

m. The Fuel-Energy Division, which works out problems connected with the improvement of fuel for light industry; it supervises the economic utilization of fuel, and controls the extension and organization of fuel bases for light industry enterprises.

n. The Bureau of Inventions, which studies the most useful inventions for the industry, and presents proposals for their utilization to the NKLP. The bureau registers and controls the introduction of new inventions and industrial improvements, and issues patents.

o. The Bureau of Standards, which establishes standards for light industry main administrations and supervises existing standards.

p. The Import-Export Sector, which plans, regulates, and controls exports and imports for light industry; it also supervises expedient use of imported goods.

q. The Inspectorate for Machines and Parts, which supervises the manufacture of machines and parts in light industry plants of the NKLP SSSR and the People's Commissariat of Machine Building.

r. The Inspectorate of Subsidiary Materials, which supervises manufacture of subsidiary materials in order to raise the quality of textile industry products produced in the plants of the Main Administration of Subsidiary Parts.

s. The Inspectorate for Cotton, which supervises inspection of fiber strength of cotton fibers in the preliminary processing plants.

t. The Inspectorate for Boilers, which supervises boilers and boiler equipment of light industry enterprises.

u. Housing Division
