

Gentlemen:

I would appreciate your directing this communication to your appropriate department - that concerned with photographic image resolution.

In my physiological optics research, a theory has been evolved which concludes that the quality of the image received by the retina of the normal eye is low, so that according to current static theories of visual resolution, we could achieve no better than 20/200 vision or thereabout. I refer you to my paper "A

The theory proposes an explanation of how normal rapid eye movements (physiological nystagmus), iris tremor and possible accommodative tremor serve as a physiological mechanism system which enables the normal eye to resolve an image of poor quality as well as it does.

A device was designed and fabricated to schematically duplicate the principle of nystagmoid compensation. Photographic experiments confirmed a graphic analysis demonstrating the refinement of blurred imagery.

It is my belief that this system may be extended so that it may be possible to optically resolve beyond the wave length of light (the currently held resolution limit of an optical system) by retrieving the information from overlapping discs of confusion so as to achieve meaningful resolution beyond the theoretical limits.

I have not yet published my work in view of the possibility that this material may be in the national interest. If the project would represent a contribution within your frame of reference, I would demonstrate and discuss my findings with your representative.






