My dear Mr. Secretary:

The Congress, in Titles IV and V of the Military Construction Act of 1955 (69 Stat. 394) authorized the construction of a Central Intelligence Agency Headquarters building. In this past session the Congress appropriated funds for its construction.

The exact site selected, as presented to the Congress in the hearings on appropriations, will comprise approximately 125 acres of land presently under the administrative control and jurisdiction of the Bureau of Public Roads and approximately 6.59 acres under the administrative control and jurisdiction of the National Park Service, both in the Langley, Virginia, area.

In conjunction with the Public Buildings Service, we have engaged an architect and are proceeding with plans for site development and construction of the building, in order to accomplish the objectives of the above legislation. Since all our planning is necessarily directly related to the site, we consider it necessary at this time to request the departments concerned to transfer to the Central Intelligence Agency administrative control and jurisdiction they now hold over the lands in question.

Members of my staff have consulted in detail with your people in the Bureau of Public Roads, and the Bureau has prepared a plat of the concerned property, which totals 122.947 acres. This is in excess of the amount needed by this Agency for the building site. The balance, of about 15 acres, will be transferred to the National Park Service. It comprises a strip along the northern portion of the property here requested, and the Park Service wishes to have it in order to permit a relocation of the George Washington Memorial Parkway which the engineers concerned with Parkway planning and construction consider desirable. Such a transfer will also recompense the Park Service for the strip of land they are transferring to us, some 6.59 acres running through the center of the property requested from you.

The General Services Administration advises that your Department declare this property excess to them, noting specifically that it is

for the use of this Agency. They will then authorize its transfer to us, and arrangements can be made for the transfer to the National Park Service of the Northern portion, the notes and boards of which are not yet fully determined. I therefore request that you declare this property excess and, upon authorization by the General Services Administration, that you transfer to this Agency the administrative control and jurisdiction you now hold. I believe that the net result of the several changes in land use will be to beautify and improve the entire Federal property holding in the Langley area and will be in the public interest.

I greatly appreciate the cooperation of your Department in making this land available.
