



MEMORANDUM FOR: THE DIRECTOR

The attached is a proposed letter for you to sign to Representative Paul C. Jones who raises some interesting points in his letter concerning the U-2 incident. His main thrust appears to be his concern that a responsible official of the U. S. Government has issued an untrue statement and asks for your personal comments on this. However, he is also somewhat inconsistent by calling the practice "immoral and reprehensible" but at the same time in his closing paragraph approving of the frank statements explaining the necessity of such practice. It occurs to me there is possibly little that we can say in writing which is directly responsive and, therefore, I am suggesting the course of a personal interview.
