
SUBJECT: Implementation of Approved Recommendations

REFERENCE: NSC Action re "Foreign Intelligence Activities"
(including Recommendations of Joint Study Group)
USIB-D-1.5/3 dated 19 January 1961

1. In view of the anticipated necessity for the Board to prepare, in the near future, a report of progress in implementing approved recommendations of the Joint Study Group, I believe it would be desirable, as an initial step, to refer to appropriate USIB committees those approved recommendations which deal with matters for which these committees are responsible. Specifically, Joint Study Group recommendations 10, 14, 15, 18, 38, 40, and 42 are among those that would fall within this category.

2. I propose, therefore, that the Board assign responsibility to the committees as indicated in the attached chart and instruct them to furnish to the Board (with a copy to the Assistant for Coordination) an initial report of progress within 30 days. The Assistant for Coordination will monitor and assist the work of the committees, and he and his Staff will be available to help and advise in the resolution of any difficulties encountered.

3. During the coming weeks, I will have further proposals for your consideration in connection with the Joint Study Group report.

No. 38 -- In order to achieve a more effective system for utilizing cost and manpower data in the entire foreign intelligence effort, the United States Intelligence Board should refine and improve its process for preparing and appraising such data by the following means:

Cost Estimates Committee

Develop data and recommendations for USIB consideration.

(a) the United States Intelligence Board's making a clear and specific determination as to those activities which properly are foreign intelligence and thus subject to the coordination of the Director of Central Intelligence and the guidance of the United States Intelligence Board.

(b) based on this determination, the United States Intelligence Board should continue to evolve an improving pattern for the development of cost and manpower data so that the resulting figures will be comparable and will permit the United States Intelligence Board to review and coordinate the effort expended on foreign intelligence activities by the several departments and agencies, especially through the review referred to in Section VII, recommendation No. 32.

No. 40 -- The United States Intelligence Board should monitor efforts to develop automatic systems to store and retrieve intelligence information and the extent to which compatibility of systems is assured.
