Dear Mr. President:

The purpose of this letter is to outline a suggestion that might be helpful in speeding up progress being made in our rocket and space programs. Undoubtedly a great amount of planning, effort, and results have already been accomplished in this field of endeavor. Therefore, the following suggestion may be entirely superfluous and considered elementary by those persons who are more knowledgeable in these activities.

I would like to suggest that an accelerated espionage program be provided with unlimited funds even in the amount of one billion dollars if necessary, for use in espionage activities with the only objective and purpose being to obtain information on Russian rocket engine and space projects.

From a layman's point of view, it would appear that the Russians made great advances in the field of atomic energy by the employment of effective espionage techniques in the United States, Canada and Great Britain. Therefore, it would seem that the United States could also gain vital information from Russian sources provided that the financial rewards were great enough to be appealing.

It appears that unless the United States makes rapid gains in our space and rocket programs the prestige of the United States will decline and the position of the Russians will be greatly increased from a propoganda standpoint. Consequently every means possible should be pursued toward this end.


