Dear Mr. Dulles:

25X1 I wish to acknowledge your letter of 26 July 1954 concerning

[Redacted]

25X1 The records of the Bureau of Naval Personnel indicate that  
25X1 [Redacted] was commissioned as an Ensign in the U.S. Naval Reserve in  
25X1 June 1950 and that he has not as yet served on active duty. Corres-  
25X1 pondence on file further indicates that in October 1953, CIA requested  
25X1 the recall of [Redacted] to active duty and his assignment to an  
25X1 intelligence billet in the U.S. Naval Advisory Group, [Redacted] However,  
25X1 due to the fact that he was totally lacking in experience as a naval  
25X1 officer and that his connection with CIA was known to the Deputy  
25X1 Director of Naval Intelligence ROK Navy, [Redacted] recall to  
25X1 active duty for the assignment proposed at that time was considered  
25X1 inadvisable.

25X1 As to the recall of [Redacted] to active duty this fall  
25X1 as a LTJG to serve for a year at sea, and his assignment thereafter to  
25X1 CIA for the remainder of his active obligated service, it is the policy  
25X1 of the Department of the Navy to effect the recall of naval reserve  
25X1 officers of the line to active duty upon their request, only when  
25X1 induction under the Selective Service System is imminent. Should it  
25X1 eventuate that [Redacted] is recalled, I am pleased to be able to  
25X1 tell you that he would be appointed in the permanent grade of LTJG upon  
25X1 his reporting for active duty. However, since [Redacted] is with-  
25X1 out any active duty experience as a naval reserve officer, it is probable  
25X1 that if he were to be on active duty with the Navy for only a year, Ensign  
25X1 [Redacted] would be in the status of a supernumerary in any ship to which  
25X1 he might be attached. Therefore, owing to the emphatic need for continuity  
25X1 of service of officers in billets in the fleet, and in consideration of  
25X1 our officer personnel ceiling, as well as our obligation to restrict the  
25X1 expenditure of limited appropriated funds, there could be no doubt that

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in the event of  recall, the best interests of the Service would require that he serve a normal two year tour of active duty with the Navy.

[redacted] who holds his commission in the Naval Reserve, has been connected with the Central Intelligence Agency for several years. Last fall the Military Personnel Division of CIA made an arrangement with the Department of the Navy for [redacted] to go on active duty with the Navy for 24 months starting October 1953. Pursuant to this arrangement, [redacted] was to spend the first twelve months at sea and the remaining twelve months on detached service assigned to CIA. About the time his orders were being out to carry out this arrangement, CIA became engaged in a very high priority project and [redacted] was asked to serve in it. Although CIA was in no position at that time to order [redacted] to do so, the nature of the work and the priority of the project were such that the request was almost the equivalent of an order. Consequently, the above Navy orders were suspended at the official request of CIA.

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[redacted] has now completed this assignment and is fully prepared to serve active duty time with the Navy. There are two issues involved which I would particularly like to bring to your attention - one, whether or not the arrangement which was agreed upon last year for [redacted] and mentioned above can be reinstated so that he can begin his twelve months of sea duty this fall instead of last fall as originally planned and thereafter be assigned by the Navy on detached service for twelve months with CIA, and two, whether or not special consideration can be given to enable [redacted] to obtain a permanent promotion to Lieutenant (jg). As I understand it, had he gone on active duty as planned last fall, he would have been eligible for this promotion in December 1953.

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The above two issues are being looked into by CIA's Military Personnel Division with the Bureau of Naval Personnel. I am, however,
