25X1 Warfield reported that Admiral Moore, CINCLANT, will visit [redacted] on 8 June. He also noted the article in the New York Times today on Air America.

Earman reported briefly on the Walter Cronkite program last night from the Dominican Republic.

Bross noted a request from General Taylor that the latter be briefed on the Soviet ABM program next Tuesday.

Executive Director noted that a nephew of Pat Coyne had been killed in an auto accident. He also noted a memo from the President on the use by the U.S. Government of its holdings of excess currency in various countries. (See Action item 1) He initiated a discussion of the depth of briefings to be furnished to our BOB examiner. Bross suggested that this be the subject of a separate meeting and the Executive Director agreed.
