MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Meeting with Mr. McGeorge Bundy,
Friday, 19 April 1963, 4:15 p. m.

1. At Mr. McCone's direction I took the Inspector General's report of the Bay of Pigs operation, bound together with all of the comments made on it, to Mr. Bundy's office. I told Mr. Bundy I understood he wanted to review it and I would be glad to answer any questions. I noted that the report contained all of the comments made on it, including a DD/P report. I explained to him how it was prepared, noting that Mr. Dulles had directed that it be prepared and that, while we had access to the minutes and papers prepared by the Taylor Committee, we had restricted ourselves to exclusively internal CIA matters.
2. Mr. Bundy asked if there was a summary and I directed him to the latter part of the Inspector General report, which he hurriedly scanned and said that he would like to keep the report because the President would probably wish to read it over the weekend. He commented that this was an aspect of the operation about which the President and himself had not been informed. I reiterated that it was strictly an internal report and had not taken into consideration any of the policy decisions.
3. He asked if I could answer the question whether the Brigade had been informed prior to the landing that they would not be supported by U. S. military forces. I told him that I could not answer this question, that I didn't think it was included in the report, but that I would be glad to check it for him. I noted that we had kept all of the various background papers in the files and that this obviously was desirable in view of the continued interest in this subject. I told him that I would check this question and advise him. In leaving I said that I would be available for any further questions that the White House might have.
