

[redacted] pointed out that most of the harshly critical comments concerning CIA had been eliminated in Drew Pearson's article which appeared in the Washington Post this morning. He questioned, however, if this were true in the case of newspapers outside of the Washington area since the fees for telegraphs which would have been necessary to change this article in all the newspapers in which Pearson's column is syndicated would have been exorbitant.
