

DAILY STAFF MEETING

Thursday, 13 September 1951

25X1 Mr. [] raised the propriety of CIA field employees commenting on approved estimates. He stated that he believed such comments should be furnished first to the Agency and not direct to the requestor as was done in the case of SE-5. []

25X1 Colonel Hansen reported that PBA had agreed to make our acquisition of [] a classified matter.

25X1 Mr. Reber reported that he had attended a Watch Committee meeting yesterday and was impressed with the job now being done. He indicated General [] attitude was "good" and that our representatives appeared to handle themselves in a more aggressive fashion. Mr. Reber noted that it was his opinion our people should comment as necessary on all matters before the Committee and not merely confine themselves to those items of direct interest to CIA. 25X1 Mr. [] stated that his main objection to Watch Committee reports was the fact that they did not contain information from "all sources".

25X1 Mr. Reber raised the question of the usefulness of the Situation Room and stated that very few people, if any, from ONE attended briefings. In this connection he stated that possibly ONE was usually cognizant of the information furnished at these briefings. Mr. [] stated that he did not believe this was correct, and he felt there was room for improvement in the caliber of briefings produced by our current situation people and if these briefings were substantially improved the proper people could not afford to miss them.
