Director's Meeting

Friday, 10 August 1951

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Mr. Wisner reported an overnight flare-up in [Redacted] case, possibly involving the integrity of one of our people. Mr. Wisner, Mr. Pforzheimer and Colonel Hansen will discuss this with the DCI.

Mr. Wisner stated that General Wyman would like to send Gen. [Redacted] to [Redacted] as [Redacted] representative. The DCI approves but stated that Gen. [Redacted] should be the CIA Senior Representative and not just represent [Redacted]. He went on to say that Gen. [Redacted] would give Gen. [Redacted] a very good send off.

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The DCI stated that Gen. [Redacted] had told the Congressional Committee that the [Redacted] belong to CIA. Mr. Pforzheimer will have to get hold of them.

Mr. Wisner inquired as to the results of the talk yesterday between the DCI and Mr. Ladd of FBI. The DCI stated that they had only discussed a possibly closer tie-in between [Redacted] and FBI and had not touched on [Redacted]. The Director feels that in regard to this operation there is no use talking to anybody except Mr. Hoover and he will not be back until September 1. The whole thing will, therefore, probably have to be dropped. If so, Mr. Jackson suggests giving [Redacted] the real explanation so they will not think CIA is uncooperative.

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Mr. Wisner stated that Col. [REDACTED] will be back on Sunday. The DCI will talk to Secretary Pace and arrange for Mr. Wisner and Col. [REDACTED] to brief Secretary Pace on our Far-Eastern operations.

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Mr. Wisner brought up the matter of [REDACTED]. The DCI stated that he would talk to the Assistant Directors about this at their next meeting. He also feels that Mr. Carey should visit his branch offices more often.
