Director's Meeting

Tuesday, 21 August 1951

Mr. Wolf reported that [redacted] appeared to be extremely able and should make a very good head for the [redacted] combined LA Division. 25X1

Mr. Dulles stated that he had a letter from Mr. Matthews, State Department, on Oil Denial under NSC 26. There still appears to be some question as to responsibility for implementation. Mr. Dulles will get recommendations from O/PC before answering letter.

Mr. Dulles reported that Senator Lodge will be briefed this afternoon by Colonel [redacted] for his trip to France. 25X1

Mr. Jackson stated that Colonel [redacted] is essential for language training and should not be sent to Indonesia. Mr. Dulles concurred. Mr. [redacted] will advise Colonel Baird and General Wyman. 25X1

Mr. Dulles stated that he had received from General Wyman a rather tough memo containing our comments on the interrogation of [redacted] is revising this and we may eventually send it to [redacted]

Mr. Dulles reported on telephonic threats to one of our people on the [redacted] and stated that it would probably be necessary to remove the [redacted] desk from other area desks and set it up as a special project. 25X1

Mr. Dulles feels that it is necessary to revise our security regulations in regard to CIA letters to State Department. He cited a letter prepared for his signature listing all kinds of [redacted] This matter will be reviewed by Mr. Wisner and Mr. Dulles. 25X1


