Director's Meeting

Monday, 10 September 1951

PRESENT: General Smith, Messrs. Dulles, Jackson, Wisner and Becker.

There was a brief discussion on the proposed intelligence annex to NSC 68. The DCI called attention to certain comments made on the paragraph indicating that the work of the IAC had been helpful and indicated that he would suggest that the work of the IAC be reviewed by an impartial group. In this connection, the names of Admiral Souers, Generals Huebner and Chamberlin (former G-2) and Mr. Jackson were mentioned. It was generally felt that the proposed draft was in a preliminary state and would be further considered by Messrs. Dulles and Jackson.




