

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DCI said that he would talk to Sherman Kent about the Yale Study. This should receive limited distribution to the NSC for what it is worth. The President is interested. At some later date, it should be raised at the NSC Senior Staff in relation to the General Security Paper.



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Mr. Dulles brought up the question as to who should go [redacted] was again mentioned, but the DCI said that this would interfere with our training program. There is great need for an intelligence-wise civilian for this job. Mr. Wisner will look into this.

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The Director stated that he had received a telegram from Dr. [redacted] stating that he cannot make the survey. The Director will now try Dr. [redacted]

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Mr. Dulles stated that Lt. Col. [redacted] might leave in the near future. The Director stated that [redacted] tour of duty was not open until next June, but that he was very anxious to go [redacted]

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

The Director will not press for [redacted] assignment. Whoever goes from Army, however, will have to be acceptable to us or we will send an additional man of our own.

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Mr. Dulles again brought up the fact that Mr. McCone is lunching with him today and will probably bring up the question of next year's [redacted]. In intelligence matters, they are very anxious for briefings to be provided by a neutral agency, probably CIA. The Director stated that we would not do it. Mr. Dulles will get further facts without making any commitment.

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
