



Mr. Dulles reported that the Senior Staff had completed its work on the Korean paper, which would be up for consideration by the NSC tomorrow (Wednesday). The only point of difference is blockade. Defense wants to start bargaining on blockade, recognizing that we probably would not get the others to agree, while State wants to begin with embargo and build up towards blockade. In answer to an inquiry by Mr. Dulles, Mr. Wisner indicated that this paper was okay
