The Director:

a. Discussed with Mr. Wisner the appearance of a former CIA officer before a Congressional Committee.

b. Asked [redacted] to send telegrams of condolence to [redacted] and [redacted]. NOTE: This has been done.

c. Referred to the cable from [redacted] and Johnston concerning CIA representation at the forthcoming [redacted] on 21 February and directed that someone from CIA attend. It was noted that it would be impossible for [redacted] to make this particular meeting. Mr. Wisner undertook to follow through on this matter. NOTE: In connection with this conference, the Director called Gen. Bolling, who indicated he would make necessary arrangements for our participation.

i. Stated that he desired to see [redacted] of the Inspector General's Division who is investigating the intelligence unit of the Signal Corp. ^{S-2-17-52} will see him on 2-29-52.
