

DEPUTIES' MEETING

Tuesday, 21 April 1953

PRESENT: Messrs. Dulles, Wisner, Wolf, Amory, Kirkpatrick, Sheldon
 and [redacted]

Mr. Dulles:

a. Briefly reported on his conversation with Adolf Berle respect-
 ing Central and South America.

b. Asked Mr. Amory to approach [redacted] in regard to
 his becoming a member of the Princeton Panel. 25X1

c. Noted a cable [redacted] requesting an appointment for
 [redacted] and asked Mr. Amory to arrange an appropriate time. (NOTE:
 Luncheon arranged for Wednesday, 22 April.)

Mr. Wisner:

a. Stated that [redacted] had reported that the whole of
 the U.S. Embassy in the Philippines was supporting Magsaysay for
 President. 25X1

b. Stated that C. D. Jackson had remarked on the excellent and
 prompt reporting [redacted] on foreign reaction to the President's speech --
 noting that the President was most appreciative. Mr. Wisner remarked
 it appeared to him that it was up to State and CIA to stimulate and
 keep alive foreign comments on this talk as long as possible. The
 Director agreed and stated that in connection with the excellent work
 [redacted] an opportunity should be given C. D. Jackson to inspect
 this operation at some convenient time -- noting that he wished to do
 this too. 25X1

c. Briefly reported on his, Mr. Kirkpatrick's and [redacted]
 inspection of a certain activity which is conducted in an outstanding
 manner on a contract basis, and remarked that our responsibilities
 under NSC 26 could well be accomplished by using the same method. 25X1
