b. Stated that Park Armstrong was of the opinion that SE-39, "Probable Consequences of the Death of Stalin", should be produced immediately, whereas the other members of the IAC and Sherman Kent were in agreement that more time was required and it was therefore recommended this estimate be published in sufficient time for consideration by the NSC at its meeting on Wednesday, 11 March. DCI approved.

c. Referred to the forthcoming visit of [redacted] and noted that in all probability [redacted] would attempt to establish closer liaison between the Agency [redacted] After some discussion as to how we should approach this matter, Mr. Becker undertook to furnish the Director his recommendations. *Done*


