Mr. Dulles:

a. Expressed his continued concern over the amount of cable traffic to and from Headquarters and directed DD/A to form a committee for the purpose of providing some type of CIA courier service between Washington and [Redacted]. The Director said he believed a substantial amount of money could be saved and saw

b. Stated that in a discussion with [Redacted] and [Redacted] he (DCI) had agreed to provide a "laundry list" of Soviet vulnerabilities, to include internal and external activities -- in short, anything that would "hurt them". Mr. Sheldon noted he had already been in touch with [Redacted] on this problem and it was going ahead. The Director said he desired the list to be completed no later than the middle of September and should have attached a glossary of source material.
