



read of OSS operations in The Scarlet Thread, or of British intelligence in the Americas during World War II in The Quiet Canadian, altho from a professional standpoint, we would have been happier if neither book had been written. But the point I wish to make is again to note the similarity of the problems set forth in the literature of intelligence, no matter where written, whether in Biblical times or our own. For the learning of our profession, we must absorb from the precedents and experiences of the past, projected into our everyday work, and despite the fact that this is overt published literature. I can only say that, on this basis, books will be written and books will be read, and to those books, gathered together as best I can in our Historical Intelligence Collection, I heartily commend and welcome you and your staffs.

U.S. BALANCE OF PAYMENTS DEFICIT
AND INTERNATIONAL GOLD FLOWS

I. Balance of Payments

1. Statement of a nations international account -- comparable to the income statement of a corporation.
 - a. receipts measure foreign demand.
 - b. payments provide a supply of currency to others.
2. The capital accounts or financial structure are presented in the reserve position whence the settlement of the income statement derives -- again as in corporate accounting practice.
3. U.S. international payments are subject to special forces because the dollar is a reserve currency as well as a currency of international account.
 - a. dollar reserve position stems from its convertibility.
4. Held as reserve, dollars constitute a potential demand for gold as well as for goods.

II. Derivation of U.S. deficit

1. Essentially U.S. payments have exceeded U.S. receipts.
 - a. Payments
Investment - Including Foreign Aid
Goods and Services - Including Military
Remittances
 - b. Receipts
Goods
Debt service
Services (Freight and Ins.)
2. Why the U.S. deficit?
 - a. Reconstruction in Europe and Assistance to new countries.
 - b. Higher yields from foreign investment.
 - c. Military necessity.

3. What has been result?

As Europe developed, needed fewer goods, wanted strong currency positions.

Buy gold with dollar receipts rather than buy goods and services.

European gold holdings up \$10 billions.

U.S. gold holdings down \$6 billions (Difference is largely newly mined gold.)

III. What can redress the flow?

1. Reduction in major flows abroad or increased purchases of U.S. goods.

2. No problem anywhere except in Europe, other dollars flow right back or flow to Europe.

3. Need to get into a better cost position vis a vis Europe or to rehabilitate capital.

a. Higher costs in Europe improve our position.

More purchases here.

Less of our investment goes there.

b. Rehabilitation of capital defeats our assistance program in these countries and requires outlets here.

IV. Don't be encouraged, we'll have a continuous problem unless we change international financial reserve system. Reserves as presently constituted are not enough now to cover transactions.

Questions:

1. How is the system able to work now if there are these problems?

A. Largely because of confidence of participating countries and willingness of some major central banks to band together to keep the system afloat.

2. Can Soviet gold operations damage or disrupt this system?

A. No! By introducing new gold into the system, the USSR helps its operation. Only Soviet positive action was to refuse to sell gold

in late 1960 when there was a concerted attack on confidence in the dollar.

3. Does this mean that money agency spends outside of Western Europe has little deleterious effect on out payments position?
 - A. In general, yes. These funds flow back to the U.S. in large part although some may flow into Europe.
