SUBJECT: Senior Staff Meeting, 6 January 1964

3. Carl Duckett, FMSAC -- Mr. Duckett explained that the purpose of FMSAC was to do a job that now is not being done any place in the US Government, that is, to analyze all information on Bloc space and missile activity. FMSAC will not duplicate GMAIC's work but will provide a base for GMAIC to do its job.

He is encouraged by the quality of the people that are being attracted to FMSAC. He mentioned the various publications that FMSAC is putting out and publication plans for the future.

4. Emmett Echols, The Agency 25th Hour Recreation Association -- Mr. Echols announced that the Agency 25th Hour Recreation Association was being formed this week. He mentioned the tremendous strides that have been made, since the move to the Langley Building, in expanding the number of activities in which Agency employees can participate. There are now four separate categories of activities: "athletics", [REDACTED] "special events", [REDACTED] "social", with [REDACTED] and "cultural", [REDACTED] Mr. Echols mentioned that a principal problem is getting funds to support the Association. Besides dues there are appropriated funds, but in the case of the Agency they are limited. It is hoped that money-making activities can be developed. Mr. Echols explained that the Agency 25th Hour Recreation Association was a very important part of the Agency's whole personnel and management program in that it oriented people to the Agency, etc.

Cord Meyer asked about the possibility of having squash courts, and Chester Cooper asked about chartered flights. In regard to the squash courts, General Carter stated that NSA had built a large

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recreation center at Fort Meade and that it might be possible some-time in the future to have such a center at Langley with squash courts, etc.

5. Paul Borel, Production Center at DIA -- Mr. Borel explained that he spent two profitable weeks at the Production Center of DIA. He received the impression that its personnel were very anxious to cooperate with the Agency and that DIA would respond quickly and helpfully to Agency cooperation. He was impressed by the number of civilian personnel in DIA even though civilians are not permitted to hold key command positions. He stated that he received the feeling that DIA is now encountering difficulties in coordination with the Services, DOD, CIA, USIB, etc. This may give the impression at times that DIA is uncoordinated or inefficient. He suggested these means by which CIA/DIA cooperation might be closer:

- a. An exchange of appropriately sanitized telephone books.
- b. Closer consultation during periods of basic planning.
- c. An exchange of tours of active duty between CIA and DIA.

Mr. Baird mentioned that DIA is establishing a training program, very similar to the Agency's JOT Program, by which DIA hopes to staff their important civilian slots.

6. General Carter, [redacted] -- General Carter said that at the direction of the DCI the present two-weeks course is being reduced to two days. The Agency is now developing plans with DOD to have about 40 individuals from DIA, the Joint Staff, etc. come to visit the Agency where they will be briefed by key Agency officers. It is hoped that when these officers learn of the extent to which CIA is involved in certain activities, that the Pentagon will not attempt to duplicate such activities.

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7. Colonel White mentioned that there are two pieces of paper which the White House directs all Agency personnel to see during January of each year: [redacted] subject: "Bribery, Graft and Conflict of Interest"; and [redacted] subject: "Employee Conduct".

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8. Mr. Fuchs mentioned that Agency pay raises under the new pay act will be reflected as follows:

a. Those on vouchered funds will receive their first pay raise on 31 January.

b. Those on unvouchered funds will receive theirs on 22 January.




