DEPUTIES' MEETING

Colonel White briefly reported on his trip to the Far East and noted that during conversations in Honolulu with Admiral Stump's Chief of Staff and J-4, it was made clear that CINCPAC is depending heavily on CAT for transportation of supplies [redacted] and it had been particularly brought out that steps should be taken to increase the number of planes being utilized for this support. He said he had also learned that CINCPAC requested authority from the Joint Chiefs to augment CAT's effort by the use of U. S. planes. General Cabell and Mr. Bissell commented that in their opinion full use is not being made of available CAT facilities and in fact the support function could be increased by 50% if this was done. Mr. Bissell also commented that he does not think there is a chance of obtaining authorization to use U. S. aircraft. The Director remarked that this might be a good time for CAT to obtain additional aircraft, possibly for free, in order to increase CAT's facilities in [redacted] other parts of the world as required.
