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Director of the Bureau of the Budget. He stated that Mr. Stans had in mind wanting to look fairly closely at certain large projects and activities such as [] and the Photographic Intelligence Center. He said he would have discussions with Mr. Helms on this before going any further with Mr. Stans.

MR. SHELDON:

a. Stated that new information was developing concerning the Pentagon and National Indications Center relocation site in the event of war. He had learned that the underground relocation facility is being enlarged considerably and it might develop that this would be an advisable place for the DCI to be located during a war situation. As a consequence he pointed out that we may have to reconsider our location plans and he is keeping in close contact with Col. White on this matter.

DR. KENT:

a. Stated that he had received a request from Air Force Intelligence to expand the big Soviet estimate, NIE 11/4, from a five year projection to a 10 year projection. The Air Force also wants incorporated in this expanded paper full tables of probable Soviet offensive and defensive hardware projected over the 10 year period. He expressed his feeling that such a request was beyond reason and that a good, practical, accurate estimate projected over this period of time could not be developed. General Cabell agreed and stated that any such estimate would certainly have to be very broad and speculative and probably not productive. This problem may come up in the near future at a U.S. Intelligence Board meeting for discussion. The DCI tended to agree with General Cabell's and Dr. Kent's comments but stated that he thought we should think the matter over and not immediately back away from the problem.



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
