[Redacted] called and said that we would receive a letter addressed to the Director from the Coast Guard. OSI have been in touch with the Coast Guard, know the contents of the letter, and will brief me before it goes in to the Director.

Talked to [Redacted], OPC, in regard to their projects coming up tomorrow at the PRC.

Told Mr. Douglass that the Director will want to talk to him about the material that is being transmitted to General Eisenhower by G-2. DCI would like to review what we are transmitting with the idea of sending a better summary, possibly over Commo channels.

Loyalty Board meeting this morning.

[Redacted] stopped in and talked at some length on the subject of scientific intelligence. The three Services want OSI to give up study on electronics, guided missiles and chemical warfare. [Redacted] left a draft memorandum which I have shown to the Deputy Director. This once more brings to a head the constant bickering in the field of scientific intelligence. I will suggest to Mr. Jackson that we have a meeting with Reber, Chadwell and [Redacted] early next week.

Called Colonel Hansen and told him that from now on the General wants him to see [Redacted]

Called [Redacted] and told him that I had asked Admiral Bieri to advise [Redacted] in OPC of any items from JCS in regard to the cease-fire negotiations.
