
Dear General Willoughby:

I appreciated your note of 2 February 1951 giving an interesting autobiography of your work and achievements. I am glad to have this for the record. All of us who are engaged in public affairs receive the usual stint of criticism. If we did not, it would mean that we were accomplishing little.

Also thanks for your note of 2 March 1951 with regard to the awards to those who played a successful part in the Korean operations. I am glad to note that [redacted] were among them. I remember you mentioned this as we were on the airfield for our departure from Tokyo.

Your book "Maneuver in War" arrived safely. I have already started reading it and, while making no claim to be a strategist, the problem interests me immensely.


A telegram just received from our people indicates you have received my letter of 6 March 1951 and a copy of my own book on Germany's underground.
