Mr. Dulles:

In Stan Grogan's absence, [redacted] called to say that he has had a request from the Scripps-Howard newspapers for your permission to put out a 1200-word excerpt of your Detroit speech under your byline. The word they originally proposed was that the article be described as "based upon" your speech. [redacted] recommends that the words "based upon" be eliminated and that it be clearly specified that the article is, in fact, excerpted from your speech and that it contains elliptical marks reflecting passages which have been omitted.
