As my office advised your staff earlier, our reply to your memorandum of 9 July concerning Mr. [redacted] was delayed until his case had been reviewed. Our Inspector General has completed a thorough review of the circumstances of Mr. [redacted] separation from our service and Mr. [redacted] has been advised of the results in a letter from Lt. General Marshall S. Carter, Deputy Director of Central Intelligence. A copy of General Carter's letter to Mr. [redacted] is enclosed for your information.

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We are also enclosing Mr. [redacted] letter of 25 June to you and the copy of his letter of 25 June 1963 to the Director of Central Intelligence which he sent to you. As stated in General Carter's reply to Mr. [redacted], the record clearly indicates that Mr. [redacted] was offered but declined to accept a position commensurate with his qualifications before his employment was terminated.

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Your inquiry concerning this matter was appreciated and we hope that the information supplied above will be helpful. We shall be glad to supply additional details if you desire.

As you requested, I have reviewed the circumstances leading to the termination of your employment by the Central Intelligence Agency in February 1961. The record clearly indicates that an effort was made to continue your employment by the Central Intelligence Agency in a position for which you were qualified and at a grade commensurate with the responsibilities of the position. The record also clearly indicates that you refused to accept the position offered you.

From my review, I conclude that the decision to terminate your employment was based upon a thorough consideration of the evidence and that the action taken was in the best interests of the Government.

Dear Senator Clark:

I am enclosing a copy of a letter which I mailed to-day to Mr. McCone, Director of the Central Intelligence Agency. I should like to reopen this matter, because Mr. McCone's attitude may be different from that of Mr. Dulles. I never actively sought employment with C. I. A. (I was recruited by this agency in 1949 because of my technical qualifications and because of the work which I had done as a member of the F.I.A.T. team in Germany on behalf of the U. S. Dept. of Commerce) and am not necessarily anxious to be re-employed on my former job at present. However, I do not believe that the actions which I describe were justified, or that they were in the interest of the United States. I took up the circumstances of my separation from C. I. A. with Representative Ryan of New York while I was still in Washington, because I was a voter in his district at the time. At present I am a resident of and a registered voter in the district in which I reside.

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
