Dear General Carter:

I acknowledge with thanks your informative letter of September 19, which has just been delivered.

What you say confirms the conclusions that we have reached here. I should say, however, that [Redacted] departure under what might be called a cloud has caused great concern in the intelligence community in External Affairs and in Defense. Most of these people attribute the transfer to [Redacted]. Some, however, would have you believe that even though it resulted from [Redacted] conversation with Mr. McCone, it was in fact suggested by Mr. McCone. I have tried to point out informally that this is quite unrealistic.

In any event, it is now a closed chapter, and I am glad to know that as far as your agency is concerned the transfer was made without prejudice to [Redacted]. He was most effective and quite highly regarded here.

Dear Mr. Ambassador:

In the absence of Mr. McCone I send you an inordinately delayed reply to your question about [Redacted] resignation. Your letter arrived after the Director's departure for his wedding and was, I regret to say, administratively mishandled in our immediate office.

The allegations with respect to [Redacted] case, as you know, from one individual only, [Redacted]. They were a complete surprise to us and we have been unable to corroborate them in any way. [Redacted] has made diligent inquiry among Embassy people and [Redacted] officials who worked with [Redacted]. In this light, you will be interested in the enclosed letter from [Redacted] in answer to a query from Mr. Ray E. Cline, our Deputy Director (Intelligence) [Redacted].

We did, however, feel it wise to shorten [Redacted] already extended tour; this without any prejudice to him whatsoever, I assure you. We are replacing him in early November with a very experienced officer, [Redacted] from our Office of Current Intelligence.

Thank you for your interest in this affair. You may be sure [Redacted] status with us is unimpaired.
