1. The following recommendations of the Inspector General, as identified by category and number in reference (c), are approved:

b. Category II, items 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15, 16,17,20,21,22,23,25,26,27,28,29,30.

2. The following recommendations of the Inspector General, as identified by category and number in reference (c), are not approved:

a. Category I, items 15,16,48,64.

b. Category II, items 18,19,24.

3. The following recommendations of the Inspector General, as identified by number in Category III, in reference (c), are approved, subject to modifications as expressed by the Deputy Director (Support): 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11.

4. The following recommendations of the Inspector General, as identified by number in Category IV in reference (c), are not approved: 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16.

5. The actions taken and being taken by the Deputy Director (Support), as outlined in reference (c), are approved.

6. While it is expected that the DD/S, in the proper exercise of his supervisory function, will continue to examine, in the light of future developments, all recommendations contained in subject survey, specific attention should be directed to the recommendations discussed in Category I, item 16; and Category II, items 18, 19, and 24. In connection with the recommendations in Category II, item 24, it is particularly important that a continuing study be made of means to keep families of Agency personnel together, when it is clearly to the advantage of the Agency to do so.

7. The comments of the DD/S in paragraph 4 of reference (c) are noted with pleasure and are taken as a recognition of the real service performed by the Inspector General and his staff in making of such surveys. The effectiveness of such surveys is in direct proportion to the intensity of study by the Inspector General and his staff, as well as the depth of consideration given to the resultant recommendations by the supervisors concerned. Both factors are evidenced in this survey and real good has been, and will be, accomplished in a meaningful way.
