

Dear Allen:

The Governor and I are leaving tomorrow for Hawaii where we hope to make further progress on the Civil Defense program, to which you gave such a notable lift by your appearance before the Governors two years ago in Puerto Rico. I am sorry that you are not going to be with us once again.

On another subject, one of the organizations in which I am interested is the Near East Foundation. This organization has had a distinguished record for forty years, first in relief work in the Near East and, more recently, in technical assistance programs on the village level. It has made an extraordinary contribution, I think, to the rural development of countries such as Iran, Jordan, Syria and Greece, among others.

I have suggested to Dr. Lyle J. Hayden, Executive Director of the Near East Foundation, that he call upon you to discuss with you some aspects of the Foundation work in which we think you will have keen interest. In view of your crowded schedule, I hope that your office can direct Dr. Hayden to the person or persons working with you who have a special interest in the Near Eastern area of the world.
