


If it is not in any conflict with the best interests of our country, I would appreciate it if you would put it in the most logical channels for him to stand the best chance of receiving it.

(Who knows, it may go microfilmed to your agent-jailer in Moscow.)

If satellites are generally accepted as legal reconnaissance tools by the mere fact that neither power can do anything about it, I, for one, can assume the logic that must have prevailed with your people when you were offered the U-2 with its 100,000 foot capabilities. I wish to congratulate the people in your organization who conceived and executed the U-2 flights. They did more to build confidence for the future of our country than anything that has happened in the last ten years.

I mention this as everywhere some small pup is telling us off, confiscating our property, and generally giving us a bad time. I am happy to learn that we are not too stupid to get in and play a little of the game that is forever serving those who are working against our interests.
