

Dear Allen:

I have recently had a long talk with one of my friends from the south of us. He is very much discouraged by the lack of organization among his compatriots in Florida and by what he considers to be the poor liaison with our government. He feels that there are no strong leaders in any of the separate groups and that such leaders as there are, are not getting proper backing.

He also feels that because there is government support it is harder to get private support which perhaps could be more effective. His suggestion is that a small committee be formed composed of outstanding compatriots of his and prominent compatriots of ours which would in effect interpret his people to us and our viewpoint to them. It seems to me that this is a very delicate subject and something that should not be undertaken without having considered it with you.

It is easy to understand that he is quite emotional on the subject. He feels that nothing can be done during the next crop and unless something drastic is accomplished before the beginning of the crop the opposition will be so heavily reinforced from abroad by the end of the crop that the situation will be practically hopeless.
