

MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Central Intelligence

SUBJECT: Inquiry of Mr. Stoddard M. Stevens  
regarding the Tolstoy Foundation

REFERENCE: ER 10 - 1600

This memorandum suggests action on the part of the DCI. Such requested action is contained in paragraph 2.

1. With regard to the Tolstoy Foundation, both  have recently been in touch with me about the financial difficulties which this organization has been facing. They both think it has been doing a good, useful job in the welfare field and SR Division concurs.

2. I recommend, therefore, that you send the attached letter in response to Mr. Stoddard M. Stevens' inquiry.



Dear Allen:

You may or may not be familiar with the Avalon Foundation, which is a New York membership corporation created and supported principally by Ailsa Mellon Bruce. The Foundation has assets of some \$60,000,000 and for many years its board consisted of Mrs. Bruce, Paul Mellon and Lauder Greenway. In November of last year, Dr. Thomas Parran and I became trustees, and last month Brewster Jennings also joined the board, so that there are now six trustees.

At a meeting of the board of trustees yesterday, there was an application from the so-called Tolstoy Foundation, Inc., which is under the leadership of Countess Alexandra Tolstoy, and which for some years participated with the State Department in helping to process and transport Russian refugees out of sympathy with the present Russian government and its philosophy. The Tolstoy Foundation has apparently operated branch offices in foreign countries near the Russian border, and it operates a farm to house and provide work and recreation for Russian refugees, which is known as the Reed Farm, in Westchester County.

Avalon has been contributing annually to this organization since 1944 and its contributions have aggregated in excess of \$500,000. We get the impression that this organization at the present time is not a particularly effective one and that Countess Tolstoy's precarious health renders the future of the organization problematical, to say the least.

Last year Avalon contributed \$40,000 to the Tolstoy Foundation, \$20,000 of which was an outright contribution and the remaining \$20,000 was to be matched by other contributions on a dollar-for-dollar basis. This matching was accomplished so that the total contribution by Avalon in 1957 was \$40,000.

The Avalon Foundation's problem is what it should do in the future and whether it should completely terminate its support.
