My dear Admiral:

This will confirm my telephonic message to you that the board meeting suggested for 9 October will not be held. I greatly appreciate your willingness to attend.

Prior commitments and responsibilities seem to make it impossible for the Board of Consultants to meet as an entity, and it now appears inadvisable to schedule regular meetings except as an emergency measure.

Since you have generously signified your willingness to assist in the guidance of the Central Intelligence Group, I am sure that, as an alternative to regularly scheduled meetings, you will be just as willing to act in an individual and personal advisory capacity. This would be of inestimable value to me and to the interests of national intelligence. I hesitate to make demands on your time but feel your guidance and advice will greatly assist the effectiveness of the Central Intelligence Group.

In view of the above, may I now request that you drop in and talk things over with me at such times as are convenient to you. I will be most thankful for your aid, encouragement and advice.

I am looking forward to your next visit to Washington.


