Mr. Dulles:

In response to your request, I attempted to call Mr. Shuman in Chicago but found he was traveling in Ohio and not available. In his absence, I spoke to Mr. Lauderbeck, General Counsel for the American Farm Bureau Federation, who was in charge in Mr. Shuman's absence.

I explained to Mr. Lauderbeck that you had just returned from Europe and that you were mailing Mr. Shuman a letter expressing your regrets that you could not accept his kind invitation to speak in Denver on 13 December.

I said you had asked me to telephone Mr. Shuman so that he would have this information at the earliest possible moment. I explained that you had a very busy schedule piling up for December, particularly with the business of transition from one administration to another which would be making heavy demands on your time, and that you were sorry indeed that you could not undertake to address the Federation at this time.

Mr. Lauderbeck expressed his great disappointment and his thanks for the telephone call.

Mr. Dulles:

Please note that on 1 October (Tab A) you advised Mr. Shuman that you would give him a firm answer the latter part of October to his request that you speak before the annual convention of the American Farm Bureau Federation in Denver on 13 December. He wrote you again on 20 October (Tab B) urging you to accept, to which we replied on 25 October (Tab C) indicating you were out of the country but his letter would be brought to your attention upon your return.

Even though Stan Grogan recommends that you accept, I recommend that you decline since, in my opinion, even though the date is a month after elections it is still too soon for you to make another major address.
