Thank you for your letter of November 11 concerning our invitation for you to visit Chapel Hill sometime in the spring.


We can certainly understanding the pressing nature of your official commitments and will await your final decision sometime in the early part of 1960. May I add that there has been considerable enthusiasm here at the university over the possibility that you may find time this spring to address the university community. Obviously, we hope that you may see your way clear to do so.

For your general information, the University of North Carolina is planning a Symposium for the week of March 27-April 1, 1960 and our spring vacations extend from April 13-20, 1960. Therefore, the most opportune dates would be as follows: (1) Any date in February; (2) Either of the first two weeks in March; (3) Any date between April 3-12 or April 21-30; or any date in May up until and including May 19.

My father forwarded me a copy of the report you made to the Congress recently in relation to the economic status of Russia and the United States and we plan to publish it in our daily student paper after Thanksgiving. I hope it may impress upon many of our students the crucial nature of the economic struggle in which we find ourselves.

Again, thanking you for your consideration and hoping to hear from you at your convenience, I am,



I appreciate your kind letter and accept with pleasure the invitation to attend the Sixteenth Traditional Breakfast at the Hotel Statler on 24 February.


