
Dear Mr. Dulles:

I am sending you, under separate cover, a personal copy of the recently published book, Communism and the Russian Peasant and Moscow in Crisis, by Herbert S. Dinerstein and Leon Goure of RAND's social science staff. The two studies contained in it were prepared as part of RAND's Air Force research program.

The book deals with the nature and effectiveness of the Soviet government's control of the people of Russia. The first study examines in detail the peacetime relationship between peasants and agricultural officials, discusses Khrushchev's role in the making of Soviet agricultural policy, and suggests the reasons for the most recent failure of the agricultural program. The second part inquires into the strains to which the urban control apparatus was subjected during the three most critical days that Moscow lived through following the Nazi attack on the Soviet Union in World War II.


