President Eisenhower

1. This memorandum contains a request submitted for DCI approval. Such request is contained in paragraph three.

2. Through his Aide, Colonel de Bonneval, on 11 December 1957, General de Gaulle requested [Redacted] to try to obtain a letter written by General de Gaulle. The letter was written to General Eisenhower on 6 September 1944. Unfortunately, General de Gaulle no longer has a copy.

3. It is requested that you approve an informal request to the White House through Brigadier General Goodpaster for the letter in question. It is felt that this rather than a formal request is an easier way of obtaining the document. As was stated in reference, we continue to feel that it is important to furnish General de Gaulle with the documents he requests in order to maintain the present excellent relationship between him and this Agency. As you are aware, General de Gaulle much appreciated our role in fulfilling his previous request.

1. Reference A concerns a request for a certain letter written in September 1944 to General de GAULLE by the then General EISENHOWER. This request was for background material for General de GAULLE's third volume of his "Memoires de Guerre".

2. Reference B contained, as an attachment, the requested letter from President EISENHOWER to be given to General de GAULLE.

3. The above mentioned letter referred to another letter dated 6 September 1944, written by General de GAULLE to General EISENHOWER. Unfortunately General de GAULLE does not have a copy of this letter. As a matter of fact - as explained in Colonel de BONNEVAL's letter (u.s.c.) - most of General de GAULLE's wartime correspondence has been lost in the various French Ministries.

4. It would therefore be greatly appreciated if the President would once again authorize that a copy of the requested letter be forwarded via this channel to General de GAULLE.

5. Under separate cover is a letter from Colonel de BONNEVAL to [Redacted] requesting the above mentioned letter and explaining the difficulties General de GAULLE is having in assembling his wartime correspondence for his "Memoires de Guerre".

After some searching the President managed to locate in his files a copy of the letter to which the General presumably refers. It is dated 13 September 1944 and is the only letter in the President's files on the subject of "Operations" around that particular date.

I am enclosing a photo-copy of this letter along with a copy of the cover note which Andy Goodpaster sent in transmitting it. Andy tells me that there is no objection to publication of this letter if, in fact, that's what the General has in mind. As you can see, the letter bears a stamp saying that it has been regraded unclassified. I hope that this will prove helpful to the General and that it is, in fact, the particular piece of correspondence he is seeking.
