Major General Orlando Collette Troxel, Jr.

Orlando C. Troxel was born on February 15, 1908, at Fort William McKinley, Philippine Islands. He was graduated from the U. S. Military Academy in June 1931 and was commissioned a second lieutenant of Field Artillery.

He was a student at the Command and General Staff College when World War II began. After graduation in February 1942, he was assigned to the 4th Infantry Division as Ass't. to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 (Operations). In July he was named as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 (Operations) with the 4th and was in that position during the Normandy assault in June 1944. He then became Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 (Operations) of the VII Corps.

In January 1946 he was appointed a member of the Joint Operation Review Board, under the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Washington, D. C. On completion of the Board in July 1946 he was assigned to the Armed Forces Information School, Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, as a member of the faculty. He then was assigned, in August 1949, to the 3d Infantry Division, Fort Benning, as Commanding Officer of Division Artillery and later as Division Executive Officer.

He became a member of the Command and General Staff College faculty, Leavenworth, Kansas, in June 1950. In August 1952 he entered the National War College as a student, Washington, D. C. Upon graduation in June 1953 he was ordered to the Far East as Division Artillery Commander for the 1st Cavalry. In July 1954 he was named as Assistant Division Commander and for two years served as Acting Division Commander and as Division Artillery Commander.

Returning from the Far East in June 1956, he was appointed Chief of Psychological Warfare, Washington, D. C. In May 1957 he became Chief of Special Warfare and, in June 1958, Director of Special Warfare, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations.
