CIA INTERESTS: The Representative introduced H. R. 12534 on May 15, 1958 to establish a Joint Congressional Committee on Foreign Intelligence by reason of alleged lack of "foreknowledge of intelligence" during period of Vice President Nixon's trip to South America. The Representative also caused to be inserted in the Congressional Record of 15 May 1958 an article in the April issue of Harpers magazine entitled, "CIA: Who Watches the Watchman?" Representative Wainwright (R., N. Y.) is reported as having stated at a dinner party that ". . . he and Congressman Peter Frelinghuysen (after having introduced a bill calling for a joint committee to supervise CIA) were 'shadowed by CIA during a trip to visit General Mark Clark." Representative Frelinghuysen did introduce H. R. 7730 on 29 July 1955 to establish a Joint Committee on Foreign Intelligence. In 1954, the Representative caused various articles to be inserted in the Appendix of the Congressional Record relating to the Hoover Commission's proposal of a check of CIA by General Clark, presumably as an endorsement of the plan. Had lunch at the Agency in July 1958. Has not introduced a joint committee proposal as yet in the 86th Congress.
