

Dear Sir:

During the period beginning with the last week in February and continuing until the middle of March 1959, our cable ship "John W. Mackay" was engaged in repair operations on our Main 2 cable which runs between St. John, Newfoundland, and Waterville, Ireland. She sighted four large Russian trawlers in the vicinity at 1600 on March 24th. The location was latitude 47° 57' 13" north and longitude 45° 46' 9" west. Our cable was badly ridden for a distance of two miles by trawler equipment. The depth of the water at this location is 240/270 fathoms and the area is north of and adjacent to the Flemish Cap.

One of our employees who has served many years on the cable ship reports that Russian trawlers operate exclusively in this area and that trawlers of other nations are encountered closer to shore in shallow water areas.

Our cable ship was unable to complete repairs because of bad weather and will return to this area approximately April 12th for that purpose. Our cable ship left two mark buoys in the area to indicate the area of operation when she returns to complete the repairs.
