







Dear Mr. Dulles:

I have just finished reading the book by Ransom entitled Central Intelligence and National Security, so while it is fresh in my mind it occurred to me to offer a suggestion for your consideration. No doubt this matter has been before you many times previously, in which case just file as a reiteration.

It seems to me that the Agency is missing a bet on one aspect of its public relations, its policy of being aloof and secretive in regard to such matters as are overt as distinguished from those which are covert. After a consideration of the data appearing in Ransom's three appendices and his bibliographical notes, one wonders if it would not be good for the Agency if this overt data were more widely disseminated and understood by the public? Why not draw a careful line between that which must remain covert and that which can be revealed, then on a gradual basis deliberately popularize the overt portion? In this connection, it seems to me that the FBI has drawn such a line and has benefited over the years from a popularization of some of its activities. My concept particularly applies to the situation when your Agency has moved to its new location.
