Dear Allen:

Once again I have the pleasure and privilege of extending to you a most cordial invitation to be our guest of honor and speaker at one of our Seminars at the Graduate School of Banking at the University of Wisconsin at Madison late in the summer.

Each year previously we have been most unlucky in choosing a time when you had planned to go abroad and I hope this year that your plans may be different and your foreign travel scheduled for another time of the year.

Our Seminar sessions are staged in the evening from Monday, August 25, through Thursday, August 28, and the following week from Monday, September 1, through Thursday, September 4. We would, of course, want you to select the evening which would be most convenient for you.

In addition to paying all your expenses from Washington to Madison and return, the School would also provide an honorarium of \$500.00.
