Dear Ed:

Last month you forwarded to me a letter you had received from [redacted] respecting his application for employment in this Agency.

[redacted] is one of the unfortunate applicants whose papers we have had to file as a result of a fairly extensive cut-back which we took in anticipation of the new economies enjoined on us by the Administration and Congress. This cut-back naturally released a number of individuals who had been with the Agency for some time. As a result, we feel we have a prior duty toward these long-time employees and our new hiring has been drastically curtailed.

I want to assure you that, as [redacted] has been told, there is absolutely nothing derogatory in his record which could have prevented his getting a position with us. You may assure him that his papers remain in our active file and should there be a vacancy for which he would be suited we will, of course, be in touch with him. I would certainly not want him to turn down any other possibilities, however, on the remote chance that something would open up for him here. If [redacted] wants a definite "yes" or "no" answer it must be "no".

I appreciate your bringing this matter to my attention.
