Allen Dulles will be grateful for your offer of assistance and I am transmitting your note on to him. I agree that attacks on CIA are unfortunate and that it is a wonderful organization. 

Dear Bedell: -

Will you please tell Allen Dulles that I am going to do all I can to help him with his problems. As you know, I am acquainted with many senators and have close friends who are close friends of senators. I also know some representatives quite well.

I think these attacks on the CIA are unfortunate. It is a wonderful organization; and the people should realize it, but secrecy is essential.

If there is any special thing that you have in mind that I could do, let me know.

The State Department has certainly done a grand job in Germany.

I still feel that the job of the Administration is far more difficult than even some of our leaders realize. I therefore think that every citizen should get behind the President, and criticize only constructively.

Harry is very fond of Secretary Humphrey and wants to help the President, so I know that he was sorry that he had to take the other side in the matter of increasing the national debt.

I hope all is well with you.
