Dear Mr. Brundage:

Thank you for your letter of September 13, 1956, raising certain questions concerning our reappropriation request for the expansion of overseas broadcasting facilities.

It is our judgment, based on a considerable body of evidence, that broadcasting activities to the European satellites, supported by our Agency, are effective. This includes not only our own intelligence reports, but [redacted] attacks of all kinds by satellite regimes, reports of representatives of U. S. missions in the Bloc, [redacted] and expert independent evaluation. As to the latter, [redacted] a mass communications consultant who conducted a survey of effectiveness of these activities as recently as August 1956 on behalf of USIA and our Agency, concluded that our broadcasting is effective and should be continued.

We, therefore, conclude that we should continue such efforts as long as the international situation warrants. It is our judgment that this will be for some time to come. Our plans, therefore, anticipate supporting satellite broadcasting efforts over a sufficient period to justify our proposed capital expenditures.

These plans have been fully coordinated with USIA. Aside from its programmed expansion of the Tangier facilities, USIA contemplates no expansion of broadcasting facilities to the satellites this year.

We have furthermore concluded that this proposal conforms to the U. S. policy toward the European satellites subsequent to the Geneva Conference.

The matter has again been reviewed by Under Secretary of State, Herbert Hoover, Jr., Mr. William H. Jackson, Special Assistant to the President, and Mr. Gordon Gray, Assistant Secretary of Defense, who had originally concurred in the proposal, in the light of the questions raised in your letter of September 18, 1956. They have reaffirmed their approval of the project.



My dear General Cabell:

The Bureau of the Budget has received and discussed with your staff [] reapportionment request relating to the proposed expansion of certain overseas broadcasting facilities.

Before acting on the pending reapportionment request, I would appreciate your assurance that the success of the broadcasting activities supported by your agency justifies the increased Government subsidies you are recommending for these activities. Furthermore, it would be most helpful before the substantial capital investments you are recommending are made to have assurance that the specific activities in question are ones you anticipate supporting over a sufficient period of time to justify the contemplated capital expenditures.

I am concerned with the apparent trend toward a substantial increase in the overseas broadcasting activities both covertly and overtly supported by the United States Government, particularly because there appears to be some question as to whether increased covert support of overseas broadcasting would be entirely consistent with our general policies since the Geneva Conference. It would be very helpful, therefore, if we could be assured that your current plans for such activities have been coordinated with the increased overseas broadcasting efforts contemplated by the Director of the United States Information Agency.
