Dear Allen:

Late this week we want to send out invitations to the annual dinner of the representatives of the Committees on Foreign Relations, to be held this year on June 5th. In our letter of invitation Joe and I thought we would announce that you will speak on "Ideological warfare and will lead an informal discussion of the problems involved in its effective use by the United States in its pursuit of Cold War objectives."
